Judge Smith was appointed NCAOC director by Chief Justice Sarah Parker, 2009. Appointed by Gov. Easley as Special Superior Court Judge, 2005. Appointed Chief District Court Judge, Fifth Judicial District, 1996, Chief Judge through 2001, Assistant District Attorney in the Fifth Prosecutorial District, 14 years. Elected District Court Judge, 1988. Commissioned officer, U.S. Army. General practice partnership in Raleigh, 1972-74. Past president, N.C. Association of District Court Judges. Board member and past treasurer, N.C. Judicial Conference. Graduate: Justice Executives Program of U.N.C. School of Business Administration, the Institute of Government, and Governor's Crime Commission; National Judicial College Special Courts Course. Board member: State Guardian Ad Litem Program, Child Custody Mediation Program, and Equitable Distribution Mediation Subcommittee of the Dispute Resolution Commission. Certified as Juvenile Court Judge, 1990. Established the Family Court for New Hanover County. Past president, New Hanover County Bar Association. Serves on the Education Committee and the Technology Committee for the N.C. Conference of Superior Court Judges. Graduate, Davidson College and Wake Forest University School of Law. Married to Harriet, a retired educator, for 43 years.
